The Archbishops invited four of the Youth Stewards to join them in a panel discussion at the top table to discuss societal issues including women in leadership, COVID lockdowns and the impact on learning, achieving future aspirations, climate change, cultural misunderstanding/racism, and importance of faith from the youth perspective.

Transforming Our Culture – The Royal Commission

Bishop Ross Bay and Ms Hera Clarke joined the Archbishops to discuss the Royal Commission and their reflections and learnings.
